Dear Friends and Easter People!

As I write this month's Pastor's Message for the "Encourager" I find myself thinking back to this time last year when I was visiting a former exchange student who lives in Barcelona, Spain. For the first time ever since I began serving the church I was not "home" to celebrate Holy Week and Easter with the church to which I was appointed. Although the Holy Week experience in Spain was quite different than any I have ever experienced, it's a Holy Week that I'll never forget.

We traveled from Barcelona to Plasencia and Caceres in western Spain where the custom is to carry huge, ornate wooden platforms upon which are beautiful statues that depict the story of the Passion of Christ as well as statues of Jesus' mother, Mary, and other key people in Jesus' life and ministry. Each one is lovingly carried by thirty or so men dressed in garb from the Middle Ages through the narrow and winding streets before a throng of people of all ages to the simple yet haunting cadence of drums along with dirge-like music played by local brass bands.

On Maundy Thursday there were the statues of the disciples sitting at the table of the Last Supper with Jesus at the head of the table. There were other platforms with statues of Jesus in other settings of that time frame of Holy Week such as Jesus praying in the garden. Good Friday platforms had statues of Christ going through his trial, beating, mocking, and carrying his cross as well as hanging on the cross where He was crucified. The platforms that followed depicted the disciples taking Jesus down from the cross as well as Jesus' limp, dead body being lovingly held in the arms of his devastated mother, Mary. I remember the mood of the crowd as being very somber with the crowd's silence broken only by an occasional whisper. Once the procession passed, the crowd dispersed and people went about their business of socializing with friends, family, and neighbors. The solemn mood was replaced by laughter, lighthearted conversation, and business as usual.

Then came Saturday...the day "in between." There was no procession through the streets on Saturday! In fact, it was as if the day was being passed over as we looked ahead to the celebration of Easter Sunday. An ocean away from home, there was a familiar similarity to how Saturday between Good Friday and Easter was observed. There is no problem knowing what to do with Easter Sunday, but we don't know what to do with the day in between the Crucifixion and the Resurrection of Christ.

"Christ Jesus...humbled himself, becoming obedient to death, even death of a cross. Because of this, God greatly exalted him." (Philippians 2:8-9)

A deafening and great silence characterizes Holy Saturday, the day "in between"! In fact, it is rare that anything worshipful is planned on this day of expectation and prayer. Everything is silent in the church. In some cases the faithful, imitating Mary, prepare for the great event of the Resurrection. While in Spain we stopped in a couple of churches and the women were cleaning and polishing and arranging fresh flowers...in silence! I would encourage each of us to remember Mary and allow the great silence which characterizes Holy Saturday to inspire us to imitate Mary as we prepare for another celebration of the Resurrection when we will once again celebrate with great joy the Light of the Resurrection that has dispelled once and for all the darkness that came over the earth at the Crucifixion and lasted through the day "in between".

All of the events of Holy Week, including Holy Saturday, the day that Jesus lays dead in a borrowed tomb, that day that we just don't know what to do with, are a unique opportunity to turn our hearts to Jesus who died for love of us. As we focus on that amazing, eternal gift of love, we are better prepared to REALLY celebrate the Resurrection on Easter Sunday and every Sunday for that matter!

A PRAYER FOR HOLY SATURDAY

Lord Jesus, help us to wait here in the in between of Holy Saturday. Unlike the first disciples, we know what lies ahead, the end of the story. We know of the Resurrection, so we don't wish to dwell in this dark place, we want to rush on to Easter Sunday, when life returns in all newness and glory. We cannot help but rejoice, for you have come!

And yet still we grieve, for the world still waits—you have yet to come. Lord Jesus, help us to pray here in the in between of Holy Saturday. For you are risen and we can't, won't, don't want to forget it, and yet we mourn with those who still wait for your kingdom's fullness of peace, hope, and justice.

Lord Jesus help us to live here in the in between of Holy Saturday. For your kingdom has come and is yet to come. And we, in some small way, hope to build, with you, all things new, in Christ Jesus, our Risen Savior and Lord.



AED

Automated External Defibrillator

Our Board of Trustees has recommended the approval to purchase 2 AED units — one to be placed in the Church Sanctuary Building and another in the Fellowship Hall.

An AED is a portable device that checks the heart rhythm and can send an electric shock to the heart to try to restore a normal rhythm. AEDs are used to treat sudden cardiac arrest, a condition in which the heart suddenly and unexpectedly stops beating.

As a public place and church that provides opportunities for worship, fellowship, and use of our buildings by outside groups, the addition of these potentially life-saving devices are a much needed and appreciated addition to our church facility. The availability of AEDs increase the survival rate of those who experience cardiac arrest to as much as 70%, over just administering CPR.

The cost of each device is \$1,175.00, so two devices will be \$2,350.00. Our Post Office Ministry has designated \$1,175.00 toward the cost of one unit. I encourage our church membership to donate toward the second life-saving device as you are led to do so. Please mark your donations "AED". (Note: No training is needed to operate the AED device as it talks the user through the steps and eliminates making any mistakes administering help.)
