Dear Easter People and Fellow Disciples of the Risen Christ!



HAPPY APRIL FOOL'S DAY....AND BY THE WAY.... NO FOOLING....CHRIST IS RISEN! HE IS RISEN INDEED!!! HAPPY EASTER!

This month's Pastor's message is a little different than previous messages. This year I'm "borrowing" a devotion from United Methodist Communications that focuses on one of our hymns written by Charles Wesley, the brother of the founder of the Methodism, John Wesley, "Christ the Lord is Risen Today." This very familiar Easter hymn is sung in United Methodist

Churches across the denomination as well as by others on Easter morning to begin the day's celebration of the Resurrection and New Life of our Risen Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. The lyrics of this familiar song of praise wonderfully celebrates how Jesus' resurrection is God's victory over death, and they call us to tell the world.

Some history:

It is reported that Charles and John Wesley published this beloved Easter hymn in their first hymnal, "Hymns and Sacred Poems in 1739. There is a section toward the back of that hymnal that includes songs for special days where "Hymn for Christmas-Day," which we now know as "Hark! The Herald Angels Sing," is just a few pages away from "Hymn for Easter-Day" that we now sing as "Christ the Lord is Risen Today." Here is a bit of trivia for you: The *alleluias* that we love and are used to singing at the end of each line of the hymn are not a part of the words that Charles Wesley penned. It is said that a later editor added the *alleluias* to make the lyrics fit the tune and to give added opportunities for praise.

Entering the story:

Charles Wesley writes about the Resurrection in the present tense, and in so doing, he invites us into the biblical story. As I have sung this song every Easter for more years than I care to remember, I can always and easily picture myself standing among the witnesses of the empty tomb on that first Easter morning and discovering that the stone had been rolled away and the tomb is EMPTY!

"Christ the Lord is ris'n today"
Sons of men and angels say,
Raise your joys and triumphs high,
Sing ye heav'ns, and earth reply.

As we participate in this amazing moment in time, we become aware of the magnitude of the Resurrection. In this opening verse, Charles Wesley introduces the theme that runs throughout the hymn: the Resurrection is celebrated both on earth and in heaven. (Our hymnal includes an edit to Wesley's second line: "Earth and heaven in chorus say" replaces his original words and emphasizes the Resurrection's impact throughout the world and beyond.") The Reverend Paul Chilcote, United Methodist scholar, writes: "The entire universe sings the triumphant chorus with earth and heaven shouting their praise back and forth in ecstatic joy."

Love's redeeming work is done, Fought the fight, the battle won... Lives again our glorious King, Where, O death, is now thy sting?

Rev. Chilcote is also quoted as saying: "Death seems to be a final word in the life of every human being. Seems to be, I say, a final word, because it isn't. The final word is life, not death. The final word is resurrection. The final word is eternal life with God who loves us." The Good News of the Resurrection is the affirmation that death does not have the final word for any and all who put their faith in Jesus Christ. In this affirmation is the gift of hope for the promise of Revelation 21:1-5. Charles Wesley calls us to live into eternal life....every day!

Soar we now, where Christ has led?
Following our exalted head,
Made like him, like him we rise,
Ours the cross—the grave—the skies!

In a later verse (not published in our hymnal) Wesley reiterates our call to follow Christ more closely each day:

Ris'n with him, we upward move, Still we seek the things above, Still pursue, and kiss the Son Seated on his Father's throne.

Life still to come:

Wesley wrote eleven verses to this Easter-Day hymn. In the final three of these verses the hymn's focus shifts to the hope of a day of resurrection for us yet to come. Charles Wesley returns to the theme of earth and heaven singing praise on that glorious day.

Hail the Lord of earth and heav'n!

Praise to thee by both be giv'n;

Thee we greet triumphant now;

Hail the resurrection thou!

The Risen Christ is the very One who brings new life to ALL of creation. The Risen Christ is the One who will bring it to completion, who will usher in the new heaven and the new earth, upon his Second Coming. And, ALL of this new life in Christ we receive by God's love....his amazing grace. We are the ones who are called to share this amazing love with the world where we live today.

King of Glory, soul of bliss, Everlasting life is this, Thee to know, thy pow'r to prove, Thus to sing, and thus to love!

Living Easter every day:

Rev. Chilcote asks the question: "We experience so many little deaths, don't we, in our lives?" The answer to his question is a resounding "YES"! Some of these deaths are literal deaths such as the loss of a friend or loved one. We also experience many other deaths and griefs as we journey this thing we call life. Jobs are lost. Hurricanes wash homes away. Churches are closed. Relationships end. The list goes on and on and on. This amazingly familiar Easter hymn, "Christ the Lord is Risen Today," proclaims loud and clear that the Risen Christ has conquered ALL those deaths.

"The central message of our faith," Rev. Chilcote states, "is the Cross and the Resurrection. Its earliest proclamation of a God who is in the business of raising us from the dead. Oh, if that isn't good news, I don't know what good news is."

On this April Ist (April Fool's Day) we will once again gather on Easter Sunday 2018 and will sing, not once but twice (the first time at our sunrise service and the second time at our morning worship at 10:30AM), this traditional song of Easter praise and joy "Christ the Lord is Risen Today." When we do we will once again celebrate Jesus' resurrection to new life and God's Good News that life in Christ conquers death once and for all. THIS IS NO JOKE!

As the Risen Christ's disciples in the world today, we must raise our joy and triumphs high. In so doing as we GO into the world, we go about the business of inviting others to join us in this NEW way of living...with hope and joy! May this Easter truly be a time of raising your joy and triumphs high!

NEW CHURCH WEBSITE



SPECIAL ANNOUNCEMENT

....Regarding Oak Street (the "alley") that runs behind our Fellowship Hall between Seffner Avenue and Wense Avenue. Please be advised by our Board of Trustees that this stretch of Oak Street is a non-vacated (active, public right-of-way). As such this street is to be free of parked vehicles and open for flow of traffic. The church was advised in August of 2012 that NO PARKING is allowed on the sides of the street. Please be aware that any parking along the fence on one side of the street and our buildings on the other side of the street could be subject to the issue of citation by the local police department or by code enforcement.

Many people use this door of the Fellowship Hall for loading and unloading. It is recommended that after any loading and/or unloading is completed that vehicles are then parked in one of our church's three parking lots. We realize that this may be seen as an inconvenience, but we don't want anyone to receive a citation for unlawful parking. (The church will not be responsible for any citations that may be issued.)
